

Cardboard Canoe Competition

18th June 2022

Joining Instructions

1. Entry is now open for Greater Manchester West County Cardboard Canoe Competition 2022. For Scouts, Explorer's and new Leaders Race for 2022. Entries must be submitted on-line and close at 8pm on Friday 11th June 2022.

Permitted Materials

Cardboard, duct tape (see rules), packing tape, rope or string. Cardboard tubes (see rules)



Need to Know

1. Bring a change of clothes, you will get WET!
2. A named leader MUST attend on the day and take full responsibility for their team. There will be a safety boat in the water but the Assembly Area is a semi-public area so teams will not be allowed to participate without a responsible adult/leader.
3. The water is very deep (as you might imagine) and so all participants under 18 will require parental consent which confirms that they can swim >50m with a buoyancy aid.
4. Food and snacks will be for sale on the day so bring a small amount of money to be looked after by your leader.
5. The Assembly Area is a hard floored area. You may bring picnic blankets/groundsheets to sit on if the weather has been wet.
6. Changing rooms and lockers are available in the Water sports Centre.

Finally...

Please note all safety equipment will all be provided by the centre.



Rules

2. Only the items listed above may be used to build boats. Cardboard tubes are permitted, but cannot have wood used to cap the ends. No pre-treated or waxed cardboard is permitted.
3. No wrapping or sealing the bottom of the boat in tape. Use tape to seal joins/seams and attach pieces or tubes. No more than a 10% of the total surface area of the boat should be covered with tape.
4. Design is Scout Group choice. Make your boat look like a race car, flying saucer, dragon, etc. Let your imagination run wild.
5. Only permanent markers can be used to decorate your boat. Do not use paint, stickers, etc.
6. All boats must be built ahead of time and pass inspection prior to racing. (on morning of race) Groups may turn up with the vessels built and ready to go or may use the Assembly area to put finishing touches to their boat.
7. Teams must remove boat and debris from the water and dispose of it away from the site at an appropriate disposal facility.
8. Each Group may have multiple entries; however, no individual may be in more than one team. You must provide your own oar and the paddle may only be used to propel the boat. Oars may be made of any material. Rafts or flat boats which use legs for propulsion are not allowed.
9. Team members in the boat must not be enclosed above the shoulders. Team members must be visible at all times while the boat is in the water.
10. Each boat must carry between 2 and 4 participants.
11. All participants must be wearing a bathing suit and shorts (no denim)
12. Each participant must be able to swim >50m with a buoyancy aid.
13. Each participant must wear a personal flotation aid and helmet when in or on the water.
14. Team members who start the race must finish the race without leaving the interior of the boat. If a team member exits the boat for any reason during the race, the team will be disqualified.
15. When a boat finishes the race, the team must remove the boat and any leftover cardboard debris from the water – only then will the clock stop.
16. Team members must supply their own towels.
17. Teams are not allowed to sabotage anyone else's boat. Any rough messing about on the water will lead to disqualification.
18. The following trophies will be awarded to the best Scout, Explorer and Leader teams in each category:

Speed Boat Award

Best Time to Complete the Course.

Design Star Award

Best Design and Theme



Titanic Award

Most Spectacular Sinking

19. Any boats deemed to be breaking the rules by Bob Wilson (ACC Scouts) will be disqualified. Any questions about whether your boat complies with the rules should be raised with Bob on the day.
20. **Entries must be submitted on-line and close at 8pm on Friday 11th June 2022.**
21. Race order will be allocated on the day. Race Operations Centre opens at 11.30am on the day.
22. Teams must ensure they are ready to race when called forward otherwise they will be disqualified.
